A Deed appointed to be Recorded

New Plymouth November 29th 1652 Know all men by these Presents that I Wosomequian Wamfutta my Son having sold unto ^{Bradford} William Cap^t. Standish Thomas Southworth John Winslow John Cooke & their associates the Purchasers or Old Comers all the Tract or Tracts of Land lying Three miles Eastward from a River called Cushenagge to a certain Harbour called Acoahisset to a small Point on the Westward side of the said Harbour and whereas the said Harbour divideth it self into severall Branches the Westmost Arm to be the Bound and all the Tract or Tracts of Land from the said Westmost Arm to the said River of Cushenagge Three miles Eastward of the same, with all the Profitts & Benefitts within the said Tract with all the Rivers Creeks Meadows Ditches and Islands that lye in or before the same, and from the sea upward to ~~the~~ go so High that the Englishs may not be annoyed by the Hunting of the Indians in any sort of their Cattle and I Wosomequian do Promise to Remove all the Indians within a year from the date hereof that doe live in the said Tract and we the said Wosomequian & Wamfutta have fully Bargained and sold unto the aforesaid ^{Mr} William Bradford Cap^t. Standish Thomas Southworth John Winslow John Cooke and the Rest of the associates the Purchasers or Old Comers to have and to hold for them & their Heirs & assigns forever, and in Consideration hereof we the above mentioned are to the said Wosomequian & Wamfutta as followeth Thirty Yards of Cloth Eight Moose Skins Fifteen Axes Fifteen Poles Fifteen Pair of Breeches Eight Blanketts Two Mittles One Cloak One pair of Wampum Eight pair Stockings Eight pair Shoes one Iron Boll and Ten Billings in another Commodity, and in Witnes hereof we have Interchangably Set Our Hands the day and Year above Written
