1689

Advised to walk wisely & circumspectly towards all men in the peaceable spirit of Christ Jesus, giving no offence nor occasion to those in Outward Government, nor way to any Controversies heats or Distractions of this world about the Kingdoms of it, but Pray for the Good of all, and submit all to that Divine Power & Wisdom which Rules over the Kingdoms of men.

It is Advised That Friends be Circumspect and not make it their Busines to Discourse of the Outward Powers but to Discourage all such things.

And Dear Friends, Altho' we gave plain Christian Advice & Admonition last year, for friends to beware of all airy Discourses, Disputes & Controversies about the Kingdoms of this world, that all might walk wisely & Circumspectly, in subjection to the Divine & over ruling Power and Wisdom of God: yet Contrariwise, to our Grief, We have heard too much Complaint & Reflections Occasioned by some who have not observed a true bridle to their Tongues, but have been too busy loose and airy in Discourses of that Nature: and therefore we do exhort and Admonish all such, in the fear of God, and as they have respect unto his holy Truth, and Innocent People, and their own safety, to be watchful, careful and Circumspect for the time to come, that none may suffer as busy bodies, nor bring suffering or reproach, or cause Jealousies to be raised upon or against others that are innocent, & singly desire the preservation Safety & Peace of all Friends in Truth & Innocency towards all Men.

This Meeting Understanding that some in the Goverment have reported, that some Persons who are called Quakers have used secret and indirect ways to take up their up their Goods without paying the Customs and Duties which the Law hath laid upon them, whereby the King is Defrauded of his Right.

This Meeting thereupon Declares it to be the Judgment of Truth and Friends, that all such practises are evil, and if any Person who Professeth Truth should be Guilty thereof, such Persons would thereby go out of Truth, and Act Contrary Thereunto.

**1709** Advised, not to put any abuse on the Gover- ment by Endeavouring to Diminsh any of the Customs, Excise, or any other Publick Civil Dues.— Yet if any going under our Profession should happen to be so far Tempted thro' Covetousness

1709 And the Love of Unrighteous gain, as to be drawn into any such Evil; We Desire you will Deal with such Persons to make them sensible of such Corrupt and pernicious Practices, that our holy Profession may not be blighted thereby: Nor any offence given nor Injury done by being concerned in prohibited goods, or Wrecks Unrighteously taken away from the Just Owners.

1715 As the Blessed Truth we Profess teacheth us to do justly unto all men in all things, even so more especially in a Faithful Subjection to the Government in all Godliness & Honesty, continuing to render to the King what is his Due in Taxes & customs payable to him according to Law.

1719 As our Testimony hath been, & still is against the Defrauding the King of any of his Customs, Duties or Excise buying Goods reasonably Suspected <sup>to be</sup> Exporting Wool, or any other Goods prohibited by Law, or doing any other thing whatsoever to the Injury of the Kings Revenues, or of the common Good, or to the hurt of the fair Trader. So if any Person or Persons under our name & Profession shall be known to be guilty of these or any such Crimes and Offences, We do Earnestly Advise the Respective Monthly Meetings to which such offenders belong that they severally reprehend & testify against such offenders & their unwarrantable Clandestine & Unlawful Actions, & Admonish them to make Restitution for the wrong done to the Government and the Holy Truth Professed by us.

Advised, That Friends behave with all Dutifulness &amp; Gratitude, and especially to Discouragement every least appearance of indecent freedom or mark of dissatisfaction in word or writing relating to the Government.

1732

It is very acceptable to us to find by the accounts from the several parts of the Kingdom, that according to former Exhortations of this Meeting, Friends continue generally careful not to defraud the King of his customs Duties or Excise; And so far to Discourage such Practices, as to avoid dealing in goods reasonably suspected to be run; this is a care highly commendable &amp; no doubt incumbent on every honest Subject; But as the Government hath signally favoured us, in our Religious Liberties, We are under the greater Obligations of Gratitude as well as Duty, to manifest that we are as truly conscientious to render to Caesar the things that are Caesars as to support any other Branch of our Christian Testimony.

1733

The last Years advice again recommended.

1734 We are glad to hear by the accounts received that Friends are generally found in the practice of their Christian Duty of rendering to Caesar the things that are Caesars, & do Earnestly recommend a strict care for the continuance of the same in every ~~as~~ Branch of the Kings Revenue.

The Advices we have received of the General care of Friends to keep clear from Defrauding the King any Branch of his revenue, are very acceptable to us, who hold it our Indispensable Duty

1736 By accounts from the several Counties we  
do not understand but that Friends are clear from  
the practice of pilfering of Goods, or defrauding the  
King of his Customs or Revenues. We earnestly re-  
commend the continuance of that necessary Duty &  
Desire that Friends every where may be care-  
ful to discourage such practices, which are not only  
unjust but also inconsistent with that gratitude  
which we as a People ought to express towards a  
Government to whose lenity & goodness we are obli-  
ged for the privileges we enjoy.

1737 Finally Brethren We recommend you to the  
Direction & guidance of the unerring Spirit of  
Truth within, & the excellent precepts and  
instructions of the holy scriptures without which  
if you shall diligently take heed unto, you will  
not fail of being perfectly instructed in the great  
Duties of worship towards God the Father and  
author of all our mercies of Fidelity & Gratitude  
to the Government, which his Merciful Providence  
has set over us, of love & peace among yourselves  
& of Justice & Benevolence & Benevolence towards all men.

1735 Agreed and Concluded at the Yearly Meet-

there is a Matter referred to this Meeting relating

## Law

No<sup>t</sup> 1<sup>r</sup> Concerning Law.

1675

As the Meeting doth not Enjoin, Impose upon, or advise any Friends in Sufferings to take Course at Law for a Remedy, so neither can we Impose upon them not to use the Law in any Case; But a Freedom is left to the Sufferers to use such means as consists with the Unity of Friends, & their own peace and Satisfaction in the Truth & in the bearing a Faithful Testimony in Righteousness.

That Friends do not Judge nor reflect upon one Another in those Cases; a Freedom being left upon Urgent Occasions, to take such Course for Relief & Ease to the Oppressed, as may not be Prejudicial to Truths Testimony.

That if any Friend or Friends apprehend a Necessity to Endeavour for Relief by the Law of the Land to stop the Destroyers &c They first advise about their Case with their respective Monthly or Quarterly Meetings, or at least with some of the Principal Friends relating thereto.

That Friends who suffer be advised not to Let out their Minds into too much Expectation of outward Relief by Friends here<sup>in</sup> point of Law; but that they Patiently & Principally Depend upon the Lord. And his Power to plead their Cause.

That Friends be careful of Entangling themselves in the Law, because of small Irregularities in Proceeding but if the Law be materially Transgressed, and the Severity of it Exceeded by our Persecutors, That Friends in Gods Wisdom use their Liberty, upon Serious & good advise among themselves, So as the Truth & its Testimony may be kept clear Over all.

A minute of this Meeting in 1720, advised That Persons Professing with us have proved so base & unworthy, as when they have run themselves into Debt to Remove themselves or their Effects to prevent Justice, whereby those Creditors who are Friends have been Deprived of an opportunity of the Common Method of Friends specified in the Minute aforesaid.<sup>b</sup> It is hereby Declared that the last paragraph of the said Minute, which prohibits Friends to sue or arrest One another &c is not intended to prevent such evil Persons in those Practices from being Dealt with by a Legal Process, as the Nature of the Case may require, of which Circumstance the Monthly & Quarterly Meetings are the proper Judges. So it is not Doubtful but they will do Justice to the parties concerned therein.

This Meeting Doth request every Monthly Meeting to appoint and Depute proper Persons out of their several Meetings, for such <sup>Friends</sup> as may have Occasion, to advise with in the Intervals of Monthly Meetings and if they see cause, to give Liberty to Recover as above.

## Marriage

N<sup>o</sup> 39 Concerning Marriage.

1675

It is our Living Sense & Judgment in the Truth of God, that not only those Marriages of near Kindred, expressly forbidden under the Law, ought not to be Practised under the Gospel. But that in as much as any Marriage of near Kindred in the times of the said was in Condescension and upon such extraordinary Occasions as upholding their Tribes & that the nearer their Marriages were the more unholie they were accounted. We in our Day ought not to approach our Near-kindred in any such respect, particularly First Cousins; being Redeemed out of those Kindred Tribes and Earthly Lots, for the upholding of which Marriages within the Kindred were once Dispensed with. And brought to that Spiritual Dispensation which gives Dominion over the Affections, & Leads to those Marriages which are more natural & are of better report. And tho' some through weakness have been Drawn into such Marriages, which being done must not be broken; yet let not their Practice be any precedent or Example to any Others amongst us for the time to come.

That such Friends as have with serious advice Due Deliberation, free & mutual Consent, as in the Sight of God, & Unity of his Blessed Truth, Absolutely agreed Espoused or Contracted upon the account of Marriage, Shall not be allowed or Owned among us in any Unfaithfulness or Injustice One to another to break or Violate any such Contract or Engagement, which is to the Reproach of Truth, or Injury one of another. And where any such Injury Breach or Violation of such Solemn Contract is known, or Complained of, or Enmity & Strife occasioned thereby

We advise & Counsel, that a few Faithful Friends, both men & women in their respective Meetings to which the parties belong, be appointed to Enquire into the cause there of, & in the Wisdom & Council of God to put a stop and speedy end thereto & bring Gods power & the Judgment thereof over them that have offended in this case, until they come to Unsigned Repentance.

And further we advise & Exhort that no engagements made, without honest Endeavours to obtain or sue regard first had to the Counsel & Consent of Parents Relations & Friends be countenanced: that so all foolish & Unbridled Affections, & all ensnaring & selfish Ends be not so much as found among you on any hand.

It is our Judgment, that for better Satisfaction to all parties, & that there may be due time for Enquiring of clearness of the Persons concerned, It is convenient that Marriages be at least twice propounded to the Meetings that are to take care therein, both to the Mens & Womens Meetings, where both are established before they are accomplished, & when things are cleared, that the Marriage be accomplished in a grave & Publick Assembly of Friends & Relations.

Advised that Parents & Guardians of Children in the Fear of God take special care to prevent those under their charge from being Engaged or Entangled with any upon the account of Marriage, before all things relating to their outward Estates be formally agreed on both parts that so no breach may be made upon the account of Outward things, to the hurt or prejudice of young People.

People among Friends, that they do not make any motion of Procedure one with another upon the Account of Marriage without first acquainting their Parents or Guardians therewith, & duly waiting upon them for their Consent & agreement therein, & We do also advise, That in the first place all young persons concerned, seriously wait upon the Lord for Counsel & Clearness in this weighty Concern, before they make any Motion or Procedure with any in Order to Marriage, that the Lord may be in their Eye, so as they may not be led by any forward, brittle or uncertain affections in this great concern to their own hurt, Grief of their Friends and dishonour of the Truth.

In order to put a Stop to an Undue Liberty in Contracting Marriages with such as are not of Our Society; It is Advised that all Parents & Guardians of Children, do take special care as much as in them lieth to prevent their Children from running into such Marriages; And that Friends of each Particular Meeting as also of the Monthly Meeting to which such persons belong, do in the Wisdom & Power of Truth Use their Endeavours to put a Stop to the said Evil, by admonishing such as may attempt to marry as aforesaid, to Desist before they accomplish the same. But if they refuse to take Counsel or privately go on to Marry as aforesaid, that then such Persons be Dealt with, according to the good Order of Truth & Judgment fixed upon all such as take such an Undue Liberty.

1730 Monthly Meeting to which they belong; such proceeding being of a clandestine nature tending to make void the just care of Friends in that case, which is of good esteem among the People; We advise that the Monthly Meeting doth not fail to Testify against the Practice, as well as against the Persons concerned therein.

And We do exhort Friends every where, that in the great Concern of Marriage, whereon much of the comfort & happiness of Life depends, they be mindful to proceed in the fear of the Lord, and have an eye to him for Counsel & Instruction in their choice; — The Neglect of which has been the ruin of many Families, and tended much to the reproach & dishonour of our holy Profession.

This Meeting having Deliberately Considered the great Exercise brought upon our Society by divers in Profession with us who contrary to our Principles and that wholesome Discipline established amongst Friends, Do Marry by the Priests with those not in Communion with us, and some who profess with us, Join in Marriage in the same manner; It's therefore earnestly requested of all Friends that they use their Utmost Endeavours to prevent all such Marriages whosoever the Party's Intentions may come to their knowledge; And that all monthly Meetings where such Marriages may happen, Immediately

Deal with the Offenders for their Outgoings, and Endeavour in the Wisdom of Truth to bring them to a true sense of their disorderly Practice, and if the Labour of Friends should have so good an Effect, that they in Sincerity give a Testimony under their hands, Contemning their said Practice, to the Satisfaction of the Monthly Meeting, In such Case Friends are Desired to use tenderness towards them; But if the Christian Care of Friends do not prevail to bring them to a true sense of their Error, then the Monthly Meeting is hereby Directed to give forth a testimony against such, for the Clearing of Truth & Friends.

And it is the Sense of this Meeting, That where any Marry contrary to the Rules of our Society as aforesaid, their Collection shall not be Received by any Meeting; Nor they be Relieved in the Manner of Poor Friends, Nor be Admitted to sit in Meetings of Discipline, Until they are Restored into Unity with the Monthly Meetings to which they formerly belonged. Yet it is not hereby Intended to hinder the Charity of Friends in their private Capacities, to Extend it when & to whom they shall see meet.

This Meeting having Deliberately Considered the great Exercise brought upon our Society by divers in Profession with us, who contrary to our known Principles, & the wholesome Discipline established among us, are joined in Marriage by the Priest with Persons either of our own, or of other Persuasions, Do earnestly advise, that all Friends use their Utmost Endeavours to prevent such Marriages whosoever the Party's Intentions may come to their knowledge.

And Dear Friends in the Love of Christ, WE Earnestly Beseech & Exhort you to watch Diligently over the Flock of God, & to Deal in due time, and in the Spirit of Christian Love and Tenderness, with all such as walk disorderly among you, in Order to reclaim and restore them by Brotherly Admonition & Counsel; And where after Patient waiting you find that your Christian Labour of Love hath not its Desired Effect, You neglect not to Testify against & Disown such persons, & thereby prevent the Reproach & Dishonour which may be brought upon our holy Profession & Religion through their Means, & that the end and design of Friends in settling Wholesom Discipline among us, may be Answered, the want of this has, as we apprehend brought great Difficulties on some Meetings, For we think it both unseasonable and dishonorable,

1717 According to the Primitive Innocency and Simplicity of Friends, It is the Advice of this Meeting That No Friends Imitate the World in any Distinction of Habit or otherwise, as marks or Tokens of mourning for the Dead. 1718

1718 Advice against men and Women imitating the World in making a shew of mourning for the Dead in their Apparel.

1724 A Caution against imitating the vain custom of wearing or giving mourning; and all Extravagant Expences about the Interment of the Dead.

1745 And Whereas a Custom hath of late prevailed with some among us, of wearing Mourning at the Funerals of their Relations, contrary to the Ancient Practice and Repeated Advice of Friends; This Desired that Friends every where would Discourage such a Custom. We fervently warn all in Proportion with us, that they be careful to avoid being any way concerned, in reaping the Unrighteous profits arising from that Iniquitous Practice of Dealing in Negroes & other Slaves whereby in the Original Purchase one man selleth another as he doth the beast that perishes, without any better pretension to a property in him than of superior force in Direct violation of the Gospel rule, which teacheth every one to do as they would be done by, & to do good unto all; being the reverse of that Quæstuous Disposition, which furnishes Encouragement to those poor Ignorant People to perpetuate their Savage War, in order to supply the Demands of this most unnatural Traffick, whereby great Numbers of Mankind free by Nature, are Subjected to inextricable Bondage, & which hath been observed to fill their Possessors with Raughliness & Tyranny, Luxury & Parbility, Corrupting the Minds, & Deleasing the Morals of their Children, to the unspeakable prejudice of Religion & Virtue & the Exclusion of that holy Spirit of universal Love Meekness & Charity, which is the unchangable Nature & the glory of true Christianity. We therefore can do no less, than with the greatest earnestness Impose it upon Friends every where, that they Endeavour to keep their hands clear of this Unrighteous Gain of Oppression.

Let the aged remember & the youth know that when apparent Signs of the plague of Leprosie appeared on the walls in the houses of Israel, was the care of the Priests Under the Law to have the houses cleansed & the lepers also: and surely Christ's priesthood should not fall short of their care to Endeavour to stop & remove the manifest tokens of the leprosie of the great sin of pride, & all superfluity of naughtiness, & therefore let all concerned be earnestly stirred up to sincere Obedience to the light of Christ our great high Priest, that he may cleanse the hearts & houses of that growing plague which tends to the ruin of families & posterities.

## Plainness

1712 Advised that none despise the day of small things nor turn aside from the plainness, Simplicity & Life of the Truth into the words, ways, customs and fashions of the world, which are vain, and will perish with the using; God having Redeemed his people out of the same, through his righteous judgments in their inward parts, knowing that whatsoever hath been condemned & overturned thereby, is never to be built up again by any that are lovers of the truth as it is in Jesus.

1715 to follow the better Examples of holy ancients Advised, that all Friends both male & female, be careful that their adorning be that of a meek & quiet spirit which in the sight of God is of great price; even as the holy men & women of old professed godliness with good works were adorned: Oh that our young men & women would follow their examples! — But to our great grief we find too many of our young men instead of observing that gospel exhortation, to be sober minded, have given way to lightness & vanity, & the pernicious effects thereof have led them into pride, so that some have cut off good heads of hair, & put on long extravagant & gay wigs, which they that are not of profession with us, see as a mark of declension from our primitive plainness.

Extravagant Wigs And likewise that our young women would cease from that unseemly & immodest appearance of their high heads, & wearing their dowses set up like the proud fashion-mongers of the world.

Danger of flying the Cross Certainly both males & females who take such undue measures, flee the gods of Christ, & if they do not repent & return, they will thereby suffer great loss: But in the bowels of Christian compassion we warn & exhort all such to come into that subjection that the yoke of Christ may be their delight, & their souls may reap the comfortable fruits of bearing the same.

1715 And Caution given against false Liberty and  
Caution Singul Ease in the Flesh which is too apt to grow  
against among some Professing the same Truth with us, in  
false Liberty this Our Day, for want of due watchfulness, and  
Obedience to the Light of Christ, & keeping low &  
Humble before the Lord, by reason whereof many  
Pride & evil marriage, Bowing, Flattery, Titles, &c. Evils get in amongst Us, Viz: Pride of Apparel  
making of mock Marriages with Persons of contrary  
Judgment, bowing & giving flattering Titles to  
Men, the saying ye or you to a single Person, and  
calling the Days of the week & the Months by heathen  
Names, to the Declining of Truths Testimony, & giving  
Occasion of stumbling to such as are seeking after  
the knowledge of the same as it is in Jesus.

1718 A Testimony against an undue Liberty which  
Testimony too many under the Profession of Truth run into to  
against the great Grief of Faithful Friends, by reason where-  
undue of the way of Truth is evil Spoken of, & our holy Pro-  
fession greatly reproached by many men among Us  
putting on extravagant Trugs & wearing their hats and  
Clothes after the vain fashions, unbecoming the gravity  
of Religious People, & too many Women Decking them-  
selves with gaudy & costly Apparel Gold Chains, Sockets,  
Necklaces, & gold watches exposed to open view, which  
vain Fashions shew more of pride & ostentation than for use & service,  
gold chains, necklaces, gold watches, naked necks & breasts, & wearing hoop'd  
naked necks & breasts, & petticoats  
petticoats besides their vain Imitation of that Immodest Fashion  
of going with naked necks & breasts, & wearing hoop'd  
Petticoats, Inconsistent with that Modesty which should  
adorn their sex, & did adorn the holy Women of old.

Furniture And in like vanity of mind Divers amongst us  
run into great extravagancies in the Furniture of  
their Houses, together with a great Declension in  
Speech Some of both sexes from that Plainness & Simplicity  
of Speech so constantly used in holy Scripture

1718 and Recommended & practised by our ancient Friends  
as well as by the Faithful in this Day.

Now this Meeting having been Under a Deep sense  
of the Love of Christ, Doth Earnestly Recommend the lay-  
ing aside of those things before mentioned, & whatso-  
ever else is a hurt to themselves, & brings a reproach  
Upon Us, for certainly it does not become the gravity  
of our Profession, or any under it to run into every  
new vain fantastick Mode or Fashion, but to keep to  
that which is modest, decent plain & useful, and  
therefore Friends Every where are Desired to stand  
witnesses against these & all other things that tend  
to lay waste our Ancient Testimony.

not adorn Children with gaudy apparel  
And that Parents in the tender years of their  
Children would not adorn them with gaudy appa-  
rel which Practice cannot come from the spirit that  
leads out of the vain customs of the world but must  
proceed from pride in the Parents & Children being led  
into such Vanities & Fineries come gradually to be in love  
with them, which is apt to increase with their years to  
that Degree, until it may be found very difficult to  
Reclaim them. 1732

keep under the power of the cross  
1732 And it is evident that the Simplicity & Distin-  
guishing Plainness of our holy Profession is too much  
lost amongst Us, respecting Language, Apparel & be-  
haviour, We therefore Earnestly exhort all to keep un-  
der the Power of the Cross of Christ, which will crucify  
to the World & the Vanities of it, & bring up in a true  
Life of self-denial agreeable to the Gospel & Example  
of our Elders. 1733

1733 And forasmuch as a true Christian Practice &  
every Branch of it, is the fruit & effect of the in-  
ward sanctification of the heart, by the Spirit of  
Christ, for which we are frequently to wait,

1735 on him in all humility & lowliness of mind; We tenderly advise that every thing tending to obstruct or divert the minds either of children or those of more advanced years from this good exercise, may be carefully avoided & taken out of the way; & it being evident that the Glory & vanity of the world, & the pleasures & diversions of it, are of this nature & tendency, we therefore advise, that all Parents & Masters in the first place be good Examples to their children & families, in an humble & circumspect walking, & with all plainness of habit & speech, which is agreeable to the gospel of Christ the Examples of our ancient Friends, & the frequent advices of this Meeting; & also that they be very careful not to indulge their children in the use & practice of things contrary thereto; For we are sensible that by such habits, of how little moment soever some may think them, the tender minds of children while very young, lifted up & drawn aside from the simplicity of truth a foundation is early laid for those undevout liberties so justly complained of; For a love & delight in those things imprudently indulged at first grows up with them & becomes strengthened more & more into confirmed habits, & thus some have become enemies to the cross of Christ & forsaken & opposed the way of truth which possibly might have been prevented by parents doing their duty in being good Examples, & not cherishing seeds of vanity & folly in their children; but on the contrary prudently discouraging every appearance of evil in them; which necessary duty, we earnestly recommend to their serious consideration & practice. 1736

1739 See also our concern to exhort all Friends, both men & women, to watch against the growing sin of pride, and to beware of adorning themselves in a manner disagreeable to the plainness & simplicity of the truth we make profession of, oh! that they would duly consider that severe reproof which the Lord by the mouth of his prophet pronounced against the haughty daughters of Zion Isa: 3: 17 when he describes even the particularities of their dressings & ornaments so displeasing to the Lord, & drawing down his judgments upon them if those things in that time were so offensive in the eyes of the Lord, how much more are they so now in a people professing the plainness & simplicity which the gospel of Christ recommends! & will saith the Apostle Paul that women adorn themselves in modest apparel with shamefacedness & sobriety, not with brocaded hair ornaments or gold or costly array, but which cometh women professing godliness with good works, 1 Tim: 2, 9, 10. — Where he plainly sheweth that such adornments are contrary to the profession of godliness. — The Apostle Peter also is very full in his exhortations on this subject, Whose Adorning saith he, Let it not be that outward Adorning of plaiting the hair & of wearing of gold, & of putting on of apparel, but let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek & quiet spirit which is in the sight of God of great price; for after this manner in the old time the holy women also who trusted in God adorned themselves, 1 Pet: 3, 4, 5. plainly intimating that those who of old were holy & trusted in God, placed not their delight in such ornaments. — oh! that ye would weigh and consider these things; Let your moderation be known unto all men, and grieve not the holy spirit of God but be ye followers of him as dear children, walking circumspectly not as fools, but as wise redeeming the time because the days are evil.

And Whereas we have with Deep Concern ob-  
served by Accounts from Divers places, that there is a great  
Declension from that Simplicity, in speech Behaviour  
& Apparel which our Worthy Ancestors were led  
into, and as we find by Experience, that the same spirit  
of Truth which led our Ancients to lay aside every thing  
unbecoming the followers of Christ will still lead in the  
same Path all who submit to its Guidance, We Earnestly  
Entreat Friends every where to watch over themselves  
in these respects & that Parents & Masters of Families would  
Labour to Convince those under their Care, how inconsistent  
the gratifying a vain & worldly spirit is with a Christian  
Life; & the plainness & purity of the Gospel: the Examples  
of Our Blessed Saviour & his followers, & of virtuous and  
holy Men in all Ages, Ought to make a due Impression  
on every Considerate Mind, & Especially on such as have had  
the Advantage of an Education in Plainness agreeable to  
such Example.

Let not any such as Degenerate in these  
Respects Excuse their own weakness under a pretence of  
the Misconduct of some who have appeared Outwardly  
plain: an Objection of very little weight, for did they  
rightly consider they would clearly see, that the  
very reason why Deceivers sometimes put on plain  
Apparel is, because true Men have been accustomed  
to wear it.

We also tenderly advise that Friends  
Especially those who should be Exemplary to others  
under their care, take heed that they Exercise plain-  
ness of speech without respect to Persons in all their  
Converse among Men, & not Calm their Testimony  
by a Cowardly Compliance, varying their Language  
According to their Company: A Practice of every  
ill Example to Our Observing Youth;

And rendering those who use it Contemptible &  
Looked upon as a kind of Hypocrites even by those  
with whom they so Comply, Such a mean Spirited Pra-  
tice seems to be Cautioned against by the Apostle  
where he advises, 1 Tim: 8, 8.—That the Deacons be grave,  
not Double Tongued;—A Caution Plainly Import-  
ing that Double Tonguedness is Inconsistent with  
the Gravity of the Gospel.
