It is important to me to explain to the reader my motivation for sharing the following story which is very gloomy and doleful. I grew up in a family which had the experience of suffering the effects of a suicide and I personally witnessed the after shock of that momentous family event. Let me briefly explain; my maternal grandfather, before I was born, took the efforts to block the ventilation around doors and windows in his place of employment (*The Wamsutta Club*), write a note, lie down and turn on the gas jets, and take his own life leaving a widow and two daughters...

One of these daughters later became my mother. I was not born until a few years after his death but for as long as I can remember (starting at about 3 years of age and I am now 83) I recall that my Grandmother, my Mother and my Aunt were all substantially distraught by that event in their lives for as long as they lived!! Without going into all the details, it has become very apparent to me that suicide in a family casts a very long and somber shadow

As an avid student of genealogy and family history I also have an academic interest in these significant events in families and <u>want to understand more of the dynamics behind them</u>. Hence, I present the doleful tale uncovered while learning about an old Dartmouth house and some of those who lived there.


THE TALE




I have set out to learn about the house at <u>197 Horseneck</u> Road






Edward Sutton Lawrence (1866-1909)

Mr. Paul Barker died at his home in Dartmouth, Mass., on Wednesday, after a long and painful illness. He leaves a widow and fourteen children. Funeral services will be held at his son's residence on Gibbs street this afternoon, after which the remains will be taken to Middletown for interment.

One of the best resources for learning about the history of Real Estate is the collection of deeds for Massachusetts found online at FamilySearch.org. Accordingly, such a search was performed and is the basis for learning much more when combined with the other documentary evidence uncovered. A table showing abstracts of these deeds is attached and explains some of the chain of ownership of the premises. However, it leaves as a mystery when the house was built since the deeds found to date do not mention the "building thereon".

Our strongest evidence found so far is the combination of the 1871 map, the 1895 map, and the statement by the granddaughter of Edward S. Lawrence, who purchased the property in 1900 from Mary M. & Frederick Mosher. Cynthia Tardif, the granddaughter tells me that when her grandfather purchased the property there was an existing house. The maps do not necessarily indicate ownership but they do represent "residence".
