Note that colonial travel was slow!

"At a man's meeting in the Town of Dartmouth the 6:day of the 1st month 1699 at the house of John Lapham wee underwritten, Peleg Slocum, Jacob Mott, Abraham Tucker, the day and year above written undertake to build a meeting House for the people of God, in Scorn called Quakers, 35 foot long 30 foot wide and 14 foot studds, To worship and serve the true and Living God in according as they are persuaded in Contience they Ought to Do, and for no other use, Interest or Purpose, but as aforesd, and when one or more of us decease, then Immediately the survivers Choose others in our room, together with the consent of the assembly of the said people, so to be and Remain to us and them forever as aforesaid, which sd House shall be compleatly finished at or before the 10 day of the 10 month next Insuing the date herof. [10-10-1699]

GREAT NEWPORT FRIENDS MEETING HOUSE

[6 month 1699]

On the 9th: "Dartmouth Friends desire to be a monthly meeting apart from Rhode Island." On the 10th the desire was approved and thereafter Dartmouth and Narragansett Monthly Meetings were to compose Rhode Island Quarterly Meeting. On the 12th: "the friends of Dartmouth hath agreed that their monthly men's and women's meeting of business shall be the next second day after the monthly meeting of worship at the house of Peleg Slocum."

A FREQUENT TOPIC WAS THE BUILDING, REPAIR, OR ADDITION TO A MEETING HOUSE

SEVERAL OF THESE WERE CASES WHEN THE DMM SUBSCRIBED SUPPORT FOR OTHER MEETINGS' BUILDINGS: AN EXAMPLE – BOSTON

on p 339 OF THE Men's Minutes 1727-1762, 20-10-1760

"Job Russell hath brought a Receipt to this Meeting Signed by Ebenezer Pope of Boston that he hath Received £10=1s=8d Lawful Mony toward the Charge of Building Friends Meeting House at Boston, Said Mony being Contributed by our monthly Meeting"

WE WILL FOLLOW SOME OF THE LOCAL SUBORDINATE **MEETINGS WHICH ILLUSTRATE THE PROCESS** NORMALLY FOLLOWED: NOTE THAT SOME OF THESE **CASES CONTINUED UNTIL A FULL MONTHLY MEETING** WAS "SET OFF", MEANING ESTABLISHED AS RUNNING **IT'S OWN "MEETING FOR BUSINESS" AND OWNING ITS** PROPERTY

THE PROCESS:

WITH PERMISSION FROM THE DMM-

(1) MEET FOR WORSHIP IN SOMEONE'S LOCAL HOME

(2) AFTER SOME TIME HAS PASSED, REQUEST FREEDOM TO EXTEND THE PERIOD (MAYBE MORE THAN ONE TIME)

(3) REQUEST AUTHORITY TO CONSIDER BUILDING A MEETING HOUSE

(4)RECEIVE APPROVAL TO PLAN & SUBMIT PLAN TO DMM

(5) RECEIVE APPROVAL TO IMPLEMENT THE PLAN

THE PROCESS: (Continued)

WITH PERMISSION FROM THE DMM-

(6) REQUEST TO MAINTAIN, REPAIR, ADD STABLES, BURYING GROUND ETC

(7)ACCEPT DMM'S GRANT OF PERMISSON & IMPLEMENT THE WORK

(8) REQUEST BEING GRANTED STATUS AS A FULL MONTHLY MEETING FOR BUSINESS, BEING "SET-OFF" FROM THE DMM

(9)WITH REQUEST GRANTED BEGIN FUNCTIONING INDEPENDENTLY

A LA "COAKSET"

AS EARLY AS 1700, IN DMM MEN'S MINUTES, [p 5]


At a monthly meeting of friends holden at the house of Peleg Slocum in Dartmouth the 1 day of the 2mo 1700 it is agreed that the 4 day meeting at Coakset shall continue there tell the meeting sees cause to remove it

THE IMPLICATION HERE IS THAT THIS MEETING [FOR WORSHIP] IN 'COAKSET' HAD BEEN GOING ON BEFORE 1ST DAY 2ND MONTH 1700

12th DAY 10th MO 1715, p155 DMM MINUTE

It is agreed at this meeting that there shall be a meeting House built on the other side of Coakset river 28 feet wide and 34 ft longue an 16 or 17 foot stud

MORE PRIMARY DOCUMENTATION:

20th DAY 2nd MO 1747, p 210 DMM MINUTE

And Joseph Tripp Jonathan Wood and Christopher Gifford to be overseers of the burying Grounds at Coakset

19th DAY 6th MO 1751, p 259 DMM MINUTE

And this meeting Concludes to renew the Deeds of the meeting House lands for **Coakset** . . . The Friends appointed to take the Deeds are for **Coakset William Gifford** And **Benjamin Tripp** & **Joseph Tripp** Sons of **Joseph Tripp**. . .

& MORE PRIMARY DOCUMENTATION:

19th DAY 12th MO 1763, p 42 DMM MINUTE

Coakset [Westport, Bristol Co MA] prepar[a]tive meeting Signify to this Meeting that they think it will be Convenient to make Some additi[ons] to their little meeting House, and also to build a Chimny Therefore this meeting doth appoint **Paul Russell Barn[abas**?] **Mosher** and **Joseph Smith** to Consider how big to build and also to Compute the Cost as near as they Can and when to build at all or not, and to make Report to the next monthly Meeting ~

& MORE

19th DAY 3rd MO 1764, p 48 DMM MINUTE

This Meeting appoints **Ichabod Eddy** and **Josep[h] Tripp** are to Carry on the Rebuilding of Coakset [Westport, Bristol Co MA] meeting Hou[se]

& SUBSEQUENTLY

16th DAY 12th MO 1765, p 90 DMM MINUTE

Coakset[Acoaxet, Westport, Bristol Co MA] Meeting Requests to have a <u>Monthly Meeting</u> <u>Granted</u> them, which this Meeting so far Concurs with as to Refer the Matter to the next Monthly Meeting for Consideration

& SUBSEQUENTLY ask for terms

17th DAY 2nd MO 1766, p 93 DMM MINUTE

Coakset[Acoaxet, Westport, Bristol Co MA] friends Still Request to have a Monthly Meeting Set off to them, and also desire a Committee to determine where to prefix the <u>Boundaries</u> between this and that Meeting and <u>all Circumstances Relating thereto</u>, Therefore **Humphry Smith, Philip Tripp, Samuel Smith, Daniel Wood, Joseph Tucker** are Appointed a Comittee for that purpose and Make Report to the next Monthly Meeting

& SUBSEQUENTLY, MM status granted

21th DAY 4th MO 1766, p 102 DMM MINUTE

And the Quarterly Meeting hath Granted our Request to have a monthly Meeting of men and women Friends Sett off at **Coaksett** [Westport, MA] according to the Boundaries prefixt [sic], and this meeting Concludes for **Coakset** friends to hold their Monthly Meeting the Seventh day before the third Second day in Each month;

ANOTHER EARLY SUBORDINATE MEETING WAS AT ACUSHNET VILLAGE

21ST DAY 12TH MO 1708, p 60 MEN'S MINUTES -<u>REQUEST</u>

And whereas it was recommended to this meeting that some friends or friendly people at Acushnet desire that there may be a meeting of worship appointed amongst them once in a month, and after some debate upon the matter , friends did unanimously agree that their Request might be Answered, thinking that it might be for the Honor of God and for the promotion of truth amongst them, and so recommens it to the Quarterly Meeting for their assistance therein.


19TH DAY 2ND MO 1709, p 60 MEN'S MINUTES -<u>GRANTED</u>

... a meeting of worship is Established at Acushnet by the Quarterly Meeting as requested, and is to be kept at last first day of Every Month.

16TH DAY 10TH MO 1728, p 18 MEN'S MINUTES -<u>PLAN TO BUILD</u>

This meeting agreas to *[Come to a Subscription] build a meeting House at Acushnet near the bigness of friends meeting House at Pembrook and Thomas Hathaway Joseph Taber Jacob Taber and Henry Tucker are appointed to See it done as Soon as Can be with Conveniency And to draw up an Epistle to the Same and John Tucker to assist them


