THE SMITH FARM


Containing saltmarsh, extensive freshwater wetlands, rare plant and animal species, scenic farmland, and recreational value, the Smith Farm is a unique parcel. In 1982, 83 acres of the Smith Farm were donated to the DNRT. The adjacent 54 acres of the original farm are now for sale and face strong development pressure. The DNRT intends to acquire this remaining acreage and reunite the Smith Farm into a protected whole with the potential for agricultural use. DNRT has a six-month option to purchase the 54 acres for \$235,000. This is a last-chance opportunity to preserve this coastal property.



In witness whereof I the said Humphry Anthony have hereunto set my hand and seal, this twenty fouchthe day of the Tenth Mouth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight ! Signed, sailed and delivered, " Humphily Anthony o in the presence of us, Frances & Bullett. Barrell Beard. Bristol & Nov 8: 1848.
