As the Meeting doth not Enjoin, Impose upon, or Advise any Friends in Sufferings to take Course at Law for a Remedy, so neither can we Impose upon them not to Use the Law in any Case; But a Freedom is left to the Sufferers to Use such means as Consists with the Unity of Friends, & their own peace and Satisfaction in the Truth & in the bearing a Faithful Testimony in Righteousness.

That Friends do not Judge nor Reflect upon one Another in those Cases; a Freedom being left upon Urgent Occasions, to take such Course for Relief & Ease to the Oppressed as may not be Prejudicial to Truths Testimony.

That if any Friend or Friends ap= =prehends a Necessity to Endeavour for Relief by the Law of the Land to stop the Destroyers &c They first advise about their Case with their Respective Monthly or Quarterly Meetings; or at least with some of the Principal Friends Relateing thereto.

That Friends who Suffer be advised not to Let out their Minds into too much Expectation of out= =ward Relief by Friends here in point of Law; But that they Patiently & Principally Depend upon the Lord. And his Power to plead their Cause.
