of the last meeting were read. Corrected and approved. The letter sent to Sydney Adams was read. The representatives to Quarterly Meeting reported their attendance with no exceptions. Donald McLeod presented a chart of the funds the Monthly Meeting has available for the use of the Apponagansett Meeting Cemetery and Building. Apponagansett Cemetery Fund available \$246.14, Apponagansett Meeting House Fund available \$747.99. Ruth Brooks in charge of the Treasurer total approximately \$3057.90. The town has a fund of \$235.00 for cemetery care. The Cemetery Commissioners control this fund. Gravestones, repair of fence and anything bordering cemetery is considered cemetery care. Mr. Sam Kelly of the Dartmouth Historical Society brought two copies of the excerpt from the Sarah Howland will. It states it is a trust fund of \$4000.00 the income of which is to be used for the care of the burial grounds of the Old Friends Meeting House. This fund has accumulated interest and is now \$11,149.07. Mr. Kelly suggested that we apply to the Old Dartmouth Historical Society to apply to the courts to see if anything can be done about releasing the income funds for the repair of the Apponagansett Meeting House in view of the fact that it seems impossible to use the money for the care of the cemetery. Mildred White was appointed to write a letter with Donald McLeod as treasurer of the meeting to sign it. The letter is to go to Davis C. Hawley, president of the Old Dartmouth Historical Society. Mr. Kelly also suggested that the Old Dartmouth Historical Society has copies of the movie "Dawn to Sea in Ships" and that it might be possible for us to borrow it to put on a fund raising campaign for the repair of the building. He said

it is possible the Old Dartmouth might help us to do this. He also suggested that we might put an article about the Apponeganett Meeting House in the Society's monthly News Letter.
